## **Conference Event Key**

The conference is structured to integrate international scholarly research activity with ongoing aboriginal political leadership activity and undergraduate and graduate education. The mixture of individuals and institutions involved in the project is ambitious and complex. To meet this challenge, the conference is structured in terms of a daily rotation of specifically defined events:

**Gwich'in Testimonial:** An address by a Gwich'in or other aboriginal leader delivered primarily to Gwich'in and University of Alberta faculty and students. A reflection on the concept of nationhood, reconciliation and treaties by way of personal and professional anecdotes and their experiences in achieving their education.

**Life Skills Workshop:** Delivered by the Student Success Centre and Career Success Centre with a focus on the practical skills required to succeed in post-secondary education, especially when living away from home.

**Nationhood, Reconciliation & Treaties Presentations**: Research presentations will be by invited professors and graduate students to Gwich'in and University of Alberta students and faculty, as well as plenary delegates.

**Research Paper Discussion Session:** Discussion sessions with Gwich'in and University of Alberta students on research presentations will be lead by the speakers who presented research papers and other facilitators. The sessions will discuss further the Nationhood, Reconciliation and Treaties Research Presentations.

**Keynote Conference Presentation:** Delivered by leading national and international scholars and aboriginal political leaders to Gwich'in and University of Alberta faculty and students, as well as plenary delegates.


